Quincy Jones Performance Center

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON (2008)

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Named in honor of one of its most well-known alumni, the Quincy Jones Performing Arts Center was built for Seattle Public Schools as part of the District's historic rehabilitation of Garfield High School. Housed in an 83,700 SF free-standing addition on site, this 600-seat theater features a state-of-the-art performance space and production booth, as well as an adjacent lobby, fully-equipped scene shop, dressing rooms, costume shop, prop and scenery storage, and a flexible drama classroom that also serves as an intimate black-box theater for more intimate performances. The facility is used for both educational programs and community events and performances.



Auburn Theater

AUBURN, WASHINGTON (2005)

This state-of-the-art 400-seat theater, housed in Auburn Mountainview High School, includes a public lobby with dedicated exterior entrance, scene and prop shop, dressing rooms and production control booth. The facility is used for both scholastic and community performances and activities.



Mt. Tahoma Theater


TACOMA, WASHINGTON (2004)

Designed and built as part of a 270,000 square foot high school replacement project, this is a 600-seat proscenium theater which supports the high school's dramatic arts program, as well as community performances, functions and events. It features a stage, two turntable sections, orchestra pit, control booth, dressing rooms, a shared make-up room, multiple storage areas, box office and lobby.




